



#### 1. ADMISSION ELIGIBILITY

#### (i) Ph. D in Engineering / Technology or related disciplines

For admission to Ph. D Programs in Engineering/Technology or related disciplines, the candidate must have minimum 60% marks or minimum grade equivalent to 60% marks in M.E./ M. Tech in relevant disciplines.

#### (ii) Ph. D in Management, Pharmacy and Non-Engineering Disciplines

For Ph. D Programs in Management, Pharmacy and Non-Engineering fields like Sciences, Humanities, the candidate must have minimum 55% marks in qualifying examination (s).

Provided that if a Department/School desires to incorporate additional eligibility requirement to cater to the specific need of the course, the concerned DRC (Departmental Research Committee) will be authorized to do so.

#### 2. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- (i) The interested candidates should apply through a formal Application Form as prescribed/ available on the Website of the University or from the Accounts Section of the University.
- (ii) Admission Entrance Test shall be conducted by the University as per syllabi of various courses available on the Website of the University. After the written test, interview shall be conducted for the candidates qualifying in the written examination for selection of candidate(s), to the course.
- (iii) Candidates who have qualified in UGC / CSIR (JRF) Examination / GATE / M .Phil (As a Regular Candidate from UGC Recognized University for admission to non-engineering disciplines), may not be required to appear for Entrance Test of the University. However, their appearance in the interview shall be mandatory for admission for such category candidates.
- (iv) A merit list will be prepared for admission based on the marks obtained in the written Test and Interview; for candidates who have been exempted from the Entrance Test as in Para (iii) above.
- (v) Admission may be made twice a year- Winter Session and Summer Session. The exact dates shall be notified on the Website of the University.
- (vi) Only a pre-determined number of students, depending upon available facilities shall be selected for admission to the Ph. D program.

#### 3. DURATION OF Ph. D PROGRAM

(i) Duration of Ph. D programme in all disciplines will be of minimum 3 years (Including Course Work) and maximum of 5 years.

(ii) However, in special circumstances, Vice Chancellor on the recommendation of DRC may grant extension up to one more year.

(iii) The duration of the Ph. D Program shall be counted from the date of Registration to the date of Ph. D Thesis submission.

#### 4. WITHDRAWAL FROM PH. D PROGRAM

A student who has been admitted to a Doctoral Program of the University may be permitted to withdraw temporarily for a period of one semester or more, due to some valid reasons, provided:

- (i) He/she applies to the University, stating fully the reasons for a short break together with supporting documents.
- (ii) There are no outstanding fees/dues or any other financial demands.
- (iii) Scholarship holders are bound by the appropriate rules of the funding agency as applicable to them.
- (iv) The decision of the VC, regarding withdrawal / short break of a student is final and binding.

#### 5. ENTRANCE TEST

- (i) The syllabus for the Entrance Test shall be as prescribed by the University from time to time and shall be displayed on the University Website.
- (ii) The Entrance Test shall be conducted at the Campus of University.

#### **6.** Departmental Research Committee (DRC)

For each Research scholar, there will be one Departmental Research Committee at Department level. The Dean (Academic) of the University will initiate the process of constituting the DRC for each research scholar with the approval of Vice Chancellor. The Constitution of DRC shall be as follows:

(i) The concerned Dean of the School

Chairman

(ii) The concerned HOD of the School

Member

(iii) Ph. D Supervisor and Co-Supervisor;

Members

(iv) One faculty member, not below the rank of Associate Professor of the University;

Member

(v) One External Expert in relevant area approved by VC

Member

Subject to the overall guidance of the Academic Council, the DRC shall perform, the following functions:

- (i) To review the current status of research of the Ph. D Scholar and critically examine the progress from time to time in every six months.
- (ii) To recommend to the Vice Chancellor to appoint the examiners for evaluating the Ph. D Thesis of the Research Scholar; 139
- (iii) To perform such other functions as may be assigned to it by the Academic Council.

- (iv) The DRC shall meet at least twice a year.
- (v) The Quorum of the DRC shall be half of the total members. In case, the External Member is unable to attend the meeting, his views may be taken in writing and put up before the Committee.
- (vi) The term of Office of the members shall be for a period of two years.

#### 7. COURSE WORK

- (i) All candidates provisionally admitted to Ph. D program shall have to complete the 'Course Work' of 12 Credits on the Campus for a minimum duration of one Semester.
- (ii) The maximum duration to complete the Course work shall be TWO years failing which the registration of the Scholar shall be cancelled.
- (iii) Minimum CGPA requirement for the Course Work shall be 5.3.
- (iv) The Course Work shall consist of the following:
  - a) Research Methodology Course which shall be compulsory for all the Scholars;
  - b) Literature Survey Course will be done on the basis of power point presentation. The assessment will be done by DRC.
  - c) Two Courses related to the Departmental subjects as recommended by the Supervisor and approved by BOS.

#### 8. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR Ph. D SUPERVISOR/CO-SUPERVISOR

- (i) A Ph. D Supervisor must hold Ph. D Degree.
- (ii) There could be more than one person supervising a Ph. D Scholar. In such cases, main supervisor should be from parents University.
- (iii) The Co-Supervisor can be external (from other Institution or Industry). However, in case of an External Co-Supervisor, he/she should meet all criteria for being supervisor. Name of Co Supervisor should be approved by VC.

#### 9. APPROVAL OF RESEARCH PROPOSAL

- (i) Upon successful completion of the course work, a Research Scholar shall be required to make a presentation of his/her literature review before the DRC. The Research Proposal should cover the following aspects:
  - a) Outline of research proposal
  - b) Current state of the literature related to the proposed topic
  - c) Summary of the current technology/developments
  - d) Proposed Methodology
  - e) References
  - f) Name of the Supervisor and Co-Supervisor

#### 10. PERFORMANCE MONITORING/PROGRESS REPORT

- (i) The academic progress of each Research Scholar shall be monitored by the DRC. For this purpose, each research scholar shall submit a progress report at the end of each semester to his Supervisor.
- (ii) The DRC after having considered the progress report of each Research Scholar, shall recommend one of the following course:

**ANNUAL REPORT 2019-20** 

- a) Continuation of registration;
- b) Continuation of registration with issuance of a warning to the research scholar suggesting steps necessary to improve his/her performance in consultation with the Supervisor(s);

#### 11. **SUBMISSION OF SYNOPSIS**

- On completion of the research work as verified by the Supervisor(s), a research scholar (i) shall be eligible to submit the Synopsis provided he has published at least two research papers in a refereed research Journal as approved by DRC / indexed in a reputed database published by the University.
- For this purpose, he/she shall be required to submit 8 copies of the Synopsis of his/her (ii) research work including bibliography to the DRC through his Supervisor(s). Thereafter, the scholar will be required to make a presentation before the DRC.

#### 12. SUBMISSION OF Ph. D THESIS

- (i) The research scholar shall submit the thesis within six months of the acceptance of the Synopsis. However, in case he fails to submit his thesis within the stipulated time period and has suitable justification for the same, the VC may, on the recommendations of DRC, grant an extension of not more than 6 months i.e. he/she may be allowed to submit his/her thesis within a period of one year from the date of acceptance of the synopsis.
- The thesis shall be a piece of research work characterized either by discovery of new facts (ii) or enunciation of a new theory or theories or by fresh interpretation of known facts. It shall bear evidence of the research scholar's capacity for analysis and judgment as well as his ability to carry out independent investigation, design or development. Further, no part of the thesis or published work shall have been submitted for the award of any other degree.
- (iii) The research scholar shall submit a certificate from his Supervisor(s) in the prescribed format that the work embodied in the thesis entitled " " is original and has been carried out by the scholar and that it has not been submitted earlier in full or in part for the award of any other diploma or degree of this or any other University.
- The preparation of the Thesis shall be in accordance with the format prescribed by the (iv) University.
- It will be the responsibility of the Supervisor(s) and the Research Scholar to get the Thesis (v) checked on one of the globally acceptable 'plagiarism checking software' approved by the University to ensure that the plagiarism levels do not exceed 15% overall.

#### APPOINTMENT OF EXAMINERS 13.

- (i) The Research Supervisor(s) shall suggest a panel of at least 6 experts in the subject area of research work out of which 3 Experts shall be from Universities.
- A person from the same University/Institute/Organization where the research scholar is (ii) employed shall not be appointed as an examiner. Further, a person from a University/Institute/Organization to which the Supervisor/Co-Supervisor of the research scholar belongs, shall not be appointed as an examiner.
- On receipt of the title and synopsis of the thesis, the Dean of the School shall send the panel (iii) of examiners as accepted by the DRC to the Vice-Chancellor who shall appoint two examiners, out of whom one may be from outside India.

(iv) In case one or more examiner appointed decline to examine the thesis, another examiner(s) out of the panel shall be appointed. In case the panel gets exhausted, DRC shall recommend additional names.

#### 14. AWARD OF PROVISIONAL DEGREE

In case the research scholar is found to be qualified for the award of Ph. D by the DRC and its recommendation is approved by the Vice Chancellor, a provisional degree shall be issued by the University on request only by Research Scholar after making corrections as suggested by the DRC.

#### 15. WITHDRAWAL OF AWARDED PH. D DEGREE

Upon complaint in writing about copying of a major portion of the Ph. D thesis and upon investigation by a committee duly appointed by VC if the complaint is found to be correct, VC may withdraw the Ph. D degree already awarded.

#### **Policy for Re-appear Examination**

Re-appear examinations of the odd semester courses will be conducted in odd semester of the Academic year.

Re-appear examinations of the even semester courses will be conducted in even semester of the Academic year.

This policy applicable to students of all programmes/enrolled in the Academic year 2019-20

### REPORT ON VARIOUS ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

(A) The Academic session for ODD Semester 2019-20 started on 29<sup>th</sup> July 2019 for senior classes and on 19<sup>th</sup> August for newly admitted students. All the academic activities for continuous evaluation such as Quiz based assignments, Mid Semester examination (23rd-30th September, 2019) in all courses of all Schools/ Departments were conducted strictly as per the Academic Calendar of the University.

Feedback of students on teaching learning was taken in 3<sup>rd</sup> week of October. Faculty wise feedback was analyzed in detail on different aspects. Based on the feedback, teachers were informed about their strengths and weaknesses in a confidential manner to improve the quality of teaching

Detention List of Students for ODD Semester 2019-20, due to shortage of attendance, was prepared by the academic Department with the help of Schoofi software which was used for marking the attendance and was confirmed by all departments. Students having 50% or more but less than 75% were given one more chance to improve their attendance by attending specialclasses for 2-4 weeks and students were able to improve their attendance and finally total 26 students were detained due to shortage of attendance

As per the Academic Calendar of the University, End Semester Exam for ODD semesters started from 27<sup>th</sup> Nov 2019. # POLICY AND PROCEDURES TO MAINTAIN AND UTILIZE PHYSICAL ANDACADEMIC SUPPORT FACILITIES IN THE CAMPUS

- The Lingaya's Vidyapeeth has a defined process, procedures and monitoring mechanisms to ensure proper maintenance and utilization of infrastructure, library, sports, laboratories, classrooms, seminar halls, auditoriums, lifts and other service installations.
- The academic requirements in classrooms, laboratories and other infrastructural resources are identified at the start of each semester. The Labs catering to the needs are provided with advanced computers with LAN and Internet with Wi-Fi access. All repair, maintenance and upkeeps of labs are maintained by their lab incharges/technical support. Maintenance work is undertaken during weekend on the basis of periodical report.
- Library: library has a good collection of Text Books, Reference Books, journals, magazines, etc. A provision of the budget for the library maintenance is made by the management. Faculty recommends the desired titles to the library and are procured from time to time. In addition, the library at Departmental level fulfil the specific needs of students and teachers.
- Transport: The University has a transport facility managed by administration to ensure the buses, vans, ambulances and cars are maintained properly efficiently. Ambulance is available in the campus 24 X 7 for students and faculty to meet any emergency.
- Work Shops: Periodic report on requirement of repairs and maintenance in Workshop are raised by the departments and forwarded to Administration office for compliance.
- Sports Complex: Various sports facilities are available and being used regularly for competitions practice. The indoor and outdoor game are facilities regularly monitored and reports are submitted to Manager administration for its upkeep, repairs and maintenance.
- Computers: An IT cell headed by a senior member to oversee the procurement, maintenance, repairs and replacement of digitalized systems like computers, laptops, projectors, audio -visual devices etc.

There are adequate number of the latest configuration computers with internet connections, Wi-Fi facility, connected through LAN and the utility software's installed in administrative offices, department laboratories, library etc. Hi-Tech Surveillance System with HD cameras along with day/night facility recording in a control room and maintained by IT.

- Classrooms: An emphasizes on quality class room with all the basic facilities like fans, lights, proper furniture and ventilation etc along with separate girls' and boys' common room and medical centre. An impressive air-conditioned auditorium 1500 capacity managed by Manager Administration boosts for academic functions and cultural events. All classrooms are cleaned on regular basis by housekeeping department. The supervisors of the building are also responsible for the maintenance of the buildings and physical facilities.
- Electrical Maintenance: A department for monitoring the power distribution system. 11 KVA substation, Gensets 720KVA, solar panel 250KW etc. are undertaken as per the maintenance schedule.
- Banking/ATM facility and services Cafeteria facility Books and Stationary facilities, Reprographic services etc.

The students of entire Lingaya's group, who seek admission in Lingaya's Vidyapeeth after qualifying 10+2/degree / diploma will be provided scholarship equivalent to 25% of the tuition fee for entire duration of the course for pursuing his/her 2nd degree from Lingaya's Vidyapeeth.

### 15) Alumni Recommendation (Blood Relation)

25% waiver in tuition fee in all the courses for the entire duration of course will be given to candidates recommended by our Alumni.(only applicable for blood relation)

### 16) Alumni Recommendation (Others)

15% waiver in tuition fee in all the courses for the entire duration of course will be given to candidates recommended by our Alumni.(applicable for candidates other than blood relation)

## 17) Faculty / Staff Scholarship (Blood Relation)

25% waiver in tuition fee in all the courses for the entire duration of course will be given to candidates recommended by our Faculty/Staff. (only applicable for blood relation)

### 18) Sibling Scholarship

Lingaya's Vidyapeeth offers a waiver of 25% in tuition fee to one of the siblings studying in our University. (Till both the siblings are studying in the University)

# Pre-requisite condition for continuation of Scholarship/Tuition Fee Walver is as under

- Preferably no backlogs at the end of the academic year.
   In case of all clear with 7+ CGPA, an additional 10% of tuition Fee will be given scholarship.
- There should not be any disciplinary action taken against the student.
- 3. More than 75% of attendance is must.
- The student is not detained from appearing in the End Semester Examination due to any reason whatsoever.
- A student will be eligible to get only one scholarship /tuition waiver at any time during the tenure of his/her stay for program he/she is admitted to.
- The fee as prescribed by the University is submitted on or before the prescribed date.
- He/She is not involved in any illegal activity / groupism / unionism.

In case of non-fulfillment of any of the above condition, the scholarship will not be continued under any circumstances and no request for continuation of the scholarship shall be entertained.
